SouthShore Property Management Update

We are (still) waiting on the Hillsborough County Public Works Department to fund and schedule sidewalk repairs – the work order # is WR14397/TP18112

Please continue with your lawn and yard maintenance, pressure washing dirty driveways and sidewalks, cleaning mailboxes and painting or replacing faded mailbox flags, and following our vehicle parking restrictions. We have asked SouthShore to continue to monitor these items; your cooperation is requested.

HOA Business

The Board is pleased that some progress has been made with 2 of the 3 properties that were not being properly maintained. SouthShore Property Management is continuing to work with the Owners and Tenants.

Foreclosure action is continuing on 3 properties with delinquent assessments.

Wildlife - Please Exercise Caution

Two residents in the Southwest section of our community have reported seeing a poisonous Coral Snake ("...Red and Yellow Beware That Fellow...").

We checked with Wildlife Joe – a wild life control trapper recommended by Hillsborough County (see the HOA website for his contact information). His advice – spreading ground-up mothballs (optionally mixed with bug killer) at the corners of the house, lanai and elsewhere will keep the snake away. You may also dispatch the snake – poisonous snakes are not protected – if you can do so safely.
