### New garbage...

The county has changed our Solid Waste disposal system. This has brought about a lot of changes, including our garbage cans. We now have big gray and blue garbage cans. The association has always worked

with home owners if they do not have room in the garage to keep their garbage cans. The new larger cans take up a lot of room in the garage. What has always been asked is that hide everyone their cans from view as best as



possible. One trick that has worked for many home owners is to place the cans on the side of their house and place a large bush in front of the cans. This will hide them from street view to improve the overall look of the community. If you have any questions please submit your requests through SouthShore Property Management for review by the Board. You can also contact the county and ask them to replace the 95 gallon gray garbage can with a smaller size can.

Note: The trucks can only pick up the garbage and recycle if the cans are placed 3 feet apart and 3 feet away from any other object. This gives the truck's automated pickup system enough room to get to each can.
